### JINNAH VS. GANDHI




### **Justice in Robes by Ronald Dworkin; Harvard University Press, 2006. (one copy)**

*In Justice in Robes, Ronald Dworkin argues that the question is much more complex than it has often been taken to be and charts a variety of dimensions—semantic, jurisprudential, and doctrinal—in which law and morals are undoubtedly interwoven. He restates and summarizes his own widely discussed account of these connections, which emphasizes the sovereign importance of moral principle in legal and constitutional interpretation, and then reviews and criticizes the most influential rival theories to his own. He argues that pragmatism is empty as a theory of law, that value pluralism misunderstands the nature of moral concepts.*




### **Law of Contempt of Court and of Legislature by Justice Tek Chand; Universal Law Publishers, 2012. (one copy)**

*Apart from the courts, it now examines contempt of legislatures and tribunals. The presentation is in four parts. Part-1 deals with the constitutional provisions. Part-2 contains the commentaries on the Contempt of Courts Act, 1971; Part-3 is a brief overview of the contempt powers of the Tribunals. And Part-4 traces the elements of contempt jurisdiction of the legislatures. The law of contempt continues to have high contemporary relevance.*




### **Justice As Fairness: A Restatement by John Rawls; Harvard University Press, 2001. (one copy)**

*This book originated as lectures for a course on political philosophy that Rawls taught regularly at Harvard in the 1980s. In time the lectures became a restatement of his theory of justice as fairness, revised in light of his more recent papers and his treatise Political Liberalism (1993). As Rawls writes in the preface, the restatement presents "in one place an account of justice as fairness as I now see it, drawing on all [my previous] works." He offers a broad overview of his main lines of thought and also explores specific issues never before addressed in any of his writings.*




### **Mediation Practice and Law by Sriram Panchu; Lexisnexis, 2011. (one copy)**

### **Public Interest Environmental Litigation in India, Pakistan, and Bangladesh by Jona Razzaque; Kluwer Law International, 2004. (one copy)**

*This research examines the growth and expansion of public interest environmental litigation (PIEL) in India and analyses the changes that are influencing the development of PIEL in Bangladesh and Pakistan. The necessity for this research lies in the rapid degradation of environment and the need of efficient environmental management in the three countries of the South Asian region. Here, we compare the legal systems of the three countries from the environmental point of view, discuss new ideas and directions.*
